FIRE REPORT

Chief Robbins asked if there were any questions on his monthly report. A short discussion about the building generator that was updated. Chief Robbins informed the board the ISO will be at the Fire house on January 10, 2023 to review necessary documents.

Chief Robbins also informed the board that the FEMA Grant that was applied for in 2021 was denied. He reminded the board of the money that he had budgeted for the gear that needed to be replaced. The money was removed from his budget in anticipation of being awarded the FEMA

Grant. Chief Robbins asked that the money be put back in the equipment budget for the Fire Department. This will purchase the necessary gear to keep the firefighters safe. The amount requested at this time to replace 3 sets of turn out gear is \$13,473.00. Treasurer Kristene Libordi informed the board that there is \$19,000.00 in the contingency account to cover this expense. Resolution 5-23 will be to move money for this transaction.

Chief Robbins asked the board if they wanted him to apply for the FEMA Grant again. After a short discussion Mayor Ingalls made a motion to have Chief Robbins apply for the FEMA Grant, seconded by Trustee Joseph Flint and carried. Mayor Ingalls asked Chief Robbins to submit the write up before submitting the grant. Chief Robbins told Mayor Ingalls the write up will be exactly the same as the one previous and the hard copy of the write up is not available until it is submitted.

Chief Robbins informed the board about the new member that needs board approval.

MAINTENANCE REPORT

Superintendent Rich Scavo informed the board that Isaac Heating and Cooling ordered the incorrect boiler and priced out the boiler system being installed as a water heater. Isaac Heating and Cooling will honor the quote given.

Boiler Maintenance Contract was discussed. Only one quote was received. After discussion with the board it was decided to wait on making a decision on the maintenance agreement until Superintendent Scavo can obtain a few more quotes.

The board and Superintendent discussed a letter received from Greenway/owner Salvatore Wachter in the Village of North Hornell. He proposed offering his service at a charge to help rid areas in the Village of weeds that develop and expand and break up any type of pavement. After

discussion, the board made no decision at this time but asked Superintendent Scavo to discuss this concern with Greenway further and report back to the board and provide them with his recommendation on how to move forward.

The board agreed to continue with the 4 step fertilizer program that the Village has done with Greenway in past years. Mayor J. Joseph Ingalls motioned to continue with the 4 step program, seconded by Trustee Brian Friedland and carried

DUMP TRUCK

Superintendent Scavo and the board discussed the purchase of the new dump truck and ideas of what account would be funding this purchase. Superintendent Scavo told the board he would rather not take money out of the CHIPS fund of \$16,000. He told the board there are several roads in the village that will need repair in the near future and he would rather keep that money in the account for those repairs. There was further discussion and no action was taken at this time to move money for payment of the new dump truck.

Superintendent Scavo told the board he had to take the dump truck to Fleet Pride, AKA T&R Towing in Hornell for repairs just to hopefully get it to last through the rest of this plowing season.
