

REGULAR MEETING OF THE NORTH HORNELL VILLAGE BOARD

MONDAY, NOVEMBER 1, 2004, 7:00 P.M.

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 P.M. by Mayor Steven Terry.

CERTIFY LIST OF 2004 UNPAID TAXES

The list of unpaid taxes from June 2004 was certified on a motion by J. Falci, second by G. Thomas and carried.

FIRE DEPT

The report of the fire department was approved on a motion by W. McNelis, second by G. Thomas and carried.

BREAK INS

Resident J. Weireck asked for information about the recent home break ins on Seneca road, as she is very concerned.

Mayor reported that he has had no information.

CAT LAW

Mayor Terry reported that the cat law would not be acted on at this meeting as we have sent it to our Attorney for review and have not had any feedback from him at this time

CORNELL STUDY

Mike Hattery who did the Cornell study will be her on November 10th, to discuss the document and answer questions.

DPW REPORT

Reported that seven water services have been replaced on Cleveland Avenue. The Southern section of 360 feet of drainage work is done in Marick Park and north section to be done in the spring.

MARICK PARK

Trustee Thomas questioned Giles if he intended to do his portion of drainage in Marick Park? Mrs. Giles replied, "no contract no work, no money coming in no money going out".

Trustee Thomas: You mean you are not going to do your part, we went through this engineering study and you agreed to do your part and we would do ours.

Mrs. Giles: It does not need to be done there is hardly any water in that hole out there.

Mr. Giles: We fully intended to do so that this summer but we asked for a contract and did not get one.

Thomas: If something happens in your subdivision and we get one of those ten-year rains, the people should sue you.

MARICK PARK

Mr. Giles: We need to know exactly right down to the last detail what is expected of us before we do anything more.

Mrs. Giles: You gave us a letter you didn't tell us how many lights or fire hydrants we should put in, it was just a vague thing.

Mr. Giles: We spent money trying to get a legal contract. If we can get these details worked out this winter we can start in the spring.

We started this project in good faith and we lived here since 1959, we did not start the housing development out there specifically to do it for us, we wanted to do it for the village and we wanted the village to cooperate with us. We did it to the best of our ability and best of our engineering what was asked of us. We have increased the tax base of the village by a million and a half. We need to get these details down on paper exactly what needs to be done and how.

Mrs. Giles: And you need to negotiate with us.

Trustee McNelis: Negotiation is all over with. We have complied with everything that people have asked and all we get is another if, and, or but and we are getting nowhere and it looks like we are not going to get anywhere. The idea of thing was we were going to do our two parts and your were going to do yours.

If anybody from that area comes in here and they got a problem with drainage of water or anything else I don't want to hear anything about it.

Mayor Terry: We had a drainage issue and there were three phases to this project from the engineering study that this village paid for to protect the residents out there and I think this Board has done everything possible to protect them, now you know where it is heading. On December 13th I am going to make a recommendation to this Board, and I am talking about taking the land from you under eminent domain.
