CODE RED

The board is considering contracting with a company to dispatch emergency information to residents. Clerk Libordi information on Code Red (annually \$1,250/year) and Nixel (\$3,024/year). The Board will look over the information and comment at the March meeting.

MINIMUM WAGE

Mayor Falci noted that the minimum wage is \$10.40/hr. Currently there is one employee working part time at a wage of \$10/hr. The board will continue with starting wage of \$10.

OTHER

SEWER FEES WAVED

There was a discussion to wave the sewer rents on parcels owned by Marion Giles on Marick Park Dr. and to buyers who purchased parcels from her located on Marick Park Dr.. The Clerk was directed to make those parcels inactive so as not to send sewer bills for those parcels. At this time, Mrs. Giles may not sell property in the Marick Park Development for the purpose of building homes. Mayor to get legal counsel regarding the restriction of building after there is no longer a subdivision.

SANITARY SEWER SURVEY

Superintendent Scavo distributed the 1999 Sewer Survey to the board for their consideration as it pertains to the current situation of pump station usage. Trustee Ingalls would like to get accurate numbers on the flow thru the Village. The board directed the Superintendent to have the flow meter on McKinley Ave checked for accuracy.
