MAINTENANCE REPORT

Superintendent Richard Scavo noted that there are 5 potential water leaks found by New York Leak Detection. Those areas are on Seneca Rd, Cleveland Ave, Marick Park Dr, Wells and corner Richland and Seneca Rd. One leak was fixed today. Superintendent Scavo will give the board a copy of the leak detection report.

The City is losing 800,000 gallons, with 125,000 gallons being attributed to the Village. Mayor Falci noted that he, Deputy Mayor Ingalls and Superintendent Scavo had a productive meeting with the City regarding the water leak issues. The City and Village are working together to fix the problem.

Trustee McCollumn asked what the status is on the pump station repairs. Superintendent Scavo replied that he was to wait on work being done until the money comes in. This was per Assemblywoman Byrne's office. Hopefully work will start in spring.

Superintendent Scavo would like the board to act quickly on the LED lighting switch over. The Village could see a savings of \$6,000 per year according to information just received from NYSEG. Mayor Falci would like this to be placed on next month's agenda along with the transportation signs for commercial traffic on Seneca Rd.
