CEO Rusby in attendance and reported that Village code states that residents are to shovel sidewalks during the winter months. It had been noted that some residents had not been in compliance.

Trustee Thomas asked how many more fire inspections were to be done. ČEO Rusby stated four and the fee is \$20. Trustee Thomas was concerned that CEO Schieder was not helping with these. He asked if Mr. Schieder stopped working. Because the Village is still paying him. Clerk Libordi stated that Mr. Schieder was in last week and asked about the fire inspections. She told him that CEO Rusby was doing the inspections.

OLD BUSINESS

LADDER TRUCK DISCUSSION

Mayor Falci stated that there has been discussion on whether the village should keep Ladder truck 15 as a back up when needed. The fire chiefs came up with a justification for keeping the truck until we purchase a tanker. The Mayor stated that we would sell the ladder if & when a new tanker is purchased. For next year's budget it will cost the Village \$3600 for its maintenance and upkeep.

Trustee Libordi asked if our insurance rating will go down without the ladder truck and will it impact our insurance. Chief Robbins stated that it would our fire insurance. Trustee Libordi was told that since the Village has a hydrant system our rating would remain consistent. Chief Robbins stated that he is not aware of that.

There was discussion on a tanker for \$300,000 and Mayor Falci stated that was out of the question and a used tanker for \$120,000 was looked at. The village currently has \$100,000 saved for a tanker. Chief Robbins stated that Trucks 85 & 58 hold combined 2000 gals and a tanker would hold approximately 3500. For Third St and Heather Heights 3 pumpers would be needed to pump up the hill. If a hydrant was placed on Third St., towards the top, that would eliminate the problem.

Trustee Libordi asked for clarification on the ladder truck use. Chief Robbins noted that the truck attends several parades and 5 to 6 fire calls per year.

SCHOOL SIGN ON CLEVELAND AVE TO BE MOVED

Mayor Falci asked if the sign in front of Mr. Spitulnik could be moved. The Mayor had not heard from the police department on this. Trustee Thomas asked Supervisor Zdanowski if it could be moved down to the empty lot owned by the Village. Supervisor stated that it was too far away from the school zone.

This information came from the DOT. Mayor stated that he was told by OIC Smith that the location was too far from the school.

Mayor Falci motioned to approve moving the sign in front of the Spitulnik house at 425 Cleveland Ave. as long as it does not cause a hardship to another resident and it is within the school boundaries. Motion was seconded by Trustee Coleman and carried.

Mayor Falci recommended to Mr. Argentieri that he do the same if he wants the County to investigate his problem. Mayor Falci read the letter that the County sent to Mrs. Schieder. In it there was an explanation as to what documentation they were looking for.
